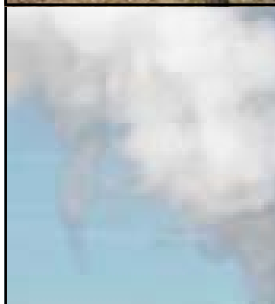
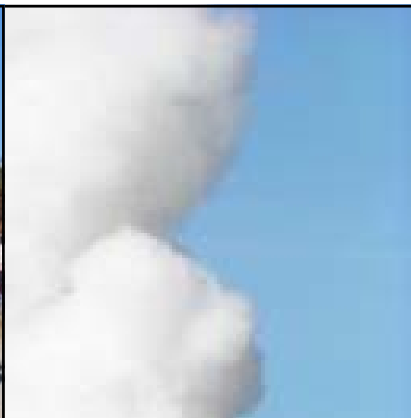
We got to drive around the arena in the Grand Parade with hundreds of tractors and steam trucks etc on each side of us on both days. We did about 3 laps each.
