We had decided to leave "Mousey" at home and take our campervan behind our Honda CRV as we had difficulty locating a trailer small enough to suit the A30 and fit in with the rated load limit of 1200kg. Then a few weeks before the event Ian Baistow offered the use of his trailer which had been built to take his 1934 10HP to Warwick AOA. As this fitted all the parameters we accepted his offer. The only problem we now had was that instead of the relative comfort of the air bed in our camper we would have to "rough it" in a tent!

We travelled via Narrandera and the Hay Plains to Port Augusta and then across The Nullarbor to Kalgoorlie, had a look at the sites around there and then on to York via Hyden and Wave Rock, arriving at our Wattle Grove campsite on the Tuesday afternoon before Easter. This gave us time to set up and find our bearings before the event and having lived only a few kms from Cronulla Beach for the past 42 years it takes a bit to get used to the ocean being West not East!

On the Friday we went down to Cannington to register and then returned in the evening for the Official Welcome and a chance to catch up with people from past AOA's. Then on Saturday we assembled at Cannington at 8.30 and departed in groups as per the comfortable cruising speed of your vehicle. This was very well done with slightly different travel routes for each group but all ending up at the same destination Whiteman Park. This is a large property which was left to the people of W.A. for community use and it also has a comprehensive Motor Museum which we all had access to. Our cars were displayed by year of manufacture in the grounds around the museum. After an excellent lunch we returned to camp and then back to Cannington for a get together and BBQ. 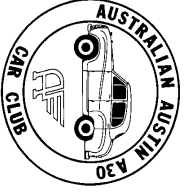

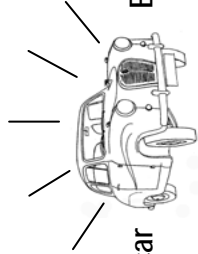
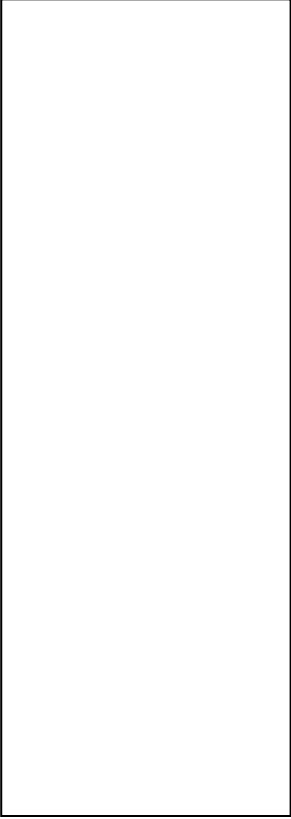
