MEN AND MOTORS OF THE AUSTIN by Barney Sharratt. Barney is a noted Austin expert researcher and this book goes behind the people who worked at Austin It tells a wonderful tale of the people who worked at Austin together with the benevolence of its founder Herbert Austin. The Austins produced at Longbridge were some of the best produced cars of the time and this book provides an insight into the reasons why they were such good cars.

POST WAR BABY AUSTINS by Barney Sharratt. Another book by Barney. If you have not read this book ,you know very little about the Austin A30.This is a good read loaded with lots of good pictures and good detail. It will make you appreciate the durability and excellent engineering that went in to producing a low cost car that did not cut corners in regard to quality.

A TUNING THE A SERIES ENGINE by David Vizard. This book is loaded with lots of technical detail about the A series engine put together in a very easy to understand format. Even if you don't want to modify your engine , this book provides some excellent advice on minor tuning improvements that can make your car perform better and be more pleasant to drive.A good read.

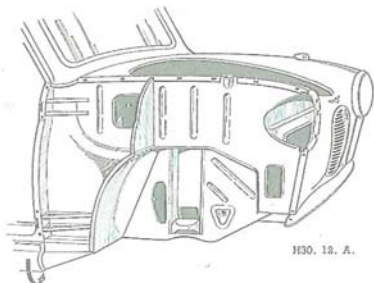
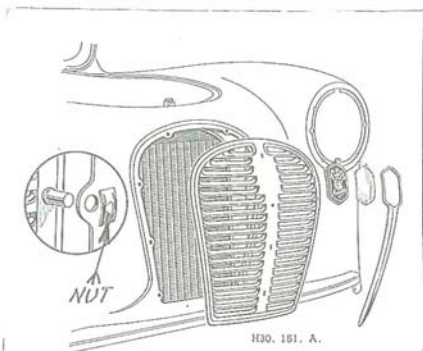

Arrow points to screw at rear bottom edge of wing.

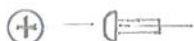

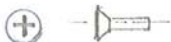

AUSTIN A30 ENGINE OIL FILTER ADAPTORS NOW FOR SALE

The original oil filter for 803 cc engines is in scarce supply and the club has had special adaptors made so that a readily available spin oil filter can be utilised.

These adaptors have already been used successfully overseas and we have improved and modified the original item and now offer them for sale to club members.

The cost of the kit is \$60 which is significantly less than having to import from overseas.

The kit includes the adaptor, a seal and a Ryco Z418 filter - which is readily available from suppliers such as Repco, Bursons, Autobarn etc. A comprehensive fitting instruction comes with the kit.

On the Road

with Bob Laughton

G'Day,

Welcome New Year to all members, families and friends. What a hot start to the year. In this part of the woods I don't think it's rained for just on 4 months. The bushfires have no postcode and go weekends and 24 hours a day. No penalty rates, What a cow of a problem they are. We drove to the Gold Coast in Lockys Magna on Gas and Daniels Ford Falcon.

We left Mooroopna at 4.30am thru Shepparton, Tocumwal, Narrandera a fuel stop. We tried to have a break every couple of hours. Lockys Gas tank we needed to fill up every stop. Daniels big petrol tank would make every second stop or what ever. LPG is not available at all at a lot of garages in NSW.

We drove in and out of at least 6 stations on the way to the Gold Coast. No LPG bowsers.

All ok next stop West Wyalong ,tank, tummy, a good drive for the two 18 year olds Lockys Magna averaged just over 10km/ltr on gas. I did not monitor the Falcon. It used a bit extra going through the Moonbi Ranges where it was about 8.5 km/ltr.

The countryside looked ok. In particular around Narrandera. All the towns we went through looked pretty prosperous to me. Lots of money about, car yards, tractors and farm machinery agents ALL full. It's a lucky country we live in. From about Tamworth the country side changed. Our first sight of green grass Since leaving home. We arrived in Armidale for the night. We booked in at a Caravan Park. Nice The Pembroke Tourist and Leisure Park. Can recommend!!

Up early next morning and left before 7am. I just wish my parents sent me to boarding school in Armidale. It must be the best inland city in Australia. I must say I saw more livestock, sheep in particular right through from Finley to Tamworth, cattle same again. And grain crops were almost harvested and stubble looked pretty thick to me. Locky got pulled up by the police about 5 k out of Tamworth. All was Ok, not speeding in the end he just had to blow a breath test and move his P plate a bit. A nice run from Armidale to Glen Innes. We were travelling higher than some clouds and needed our lights full on, Glen Innes to Grafton.

ON THE ROAD CONTINUED

Well what a nice drive that is plenty of twists and turns and climbing as well. Right through to Casino, green grass, a short hop to Lismore, where we went A few back roads to Billinudgel, where my Older son and my Granddaughter live. They had lunch with us. The old Hotel is Heritage listed. Its all weather board and about 150 years old. Lovely, the only problem with it, it is on the river bank And if the area gets more than 50mm of rain the river rises and goes into the Hotel. We had a good day all the time with the kids. We fed a couple of Filled Neck Lizards. Locky nearly ran over a couple of them.

After lunch on to our destination on the Gold Coast- ie Burleigh Heads Caravan Park. It was great there and we had a nice unit. The ocean over the road- And a rain forest walk, just to the right of us. The weather was warmer than Vic. Almost too hot. I would go for an hours walk each morning. The only old cars I saw on the whole trip was a Morris 850, a Valiant station wagon and a sedan On my morning walks.

We bought tickets on the internet for the theme parks. It's cheaper that way. To buy at the gate it's about \$85 per day. The internet price is about half the price. All went for a swim. If we had time we bought nice fish and chips. Yummy at Burleigh. Imee and the kids went to the casino(Jupiters) in Surfers Paradise.

Daniel played a hand of poker and won \$400. They were then out of there. The Theme Parks about 20km from the Gold Coast that is Surfers etc. It was warm each day and I was glad I carried water with me. Theme Parks— We & Wild Good. Main Toilet Block had a blockage and was fixed late in the afternoon. Smelly Movie World—The hottest day, no ice for the Coca Cola drinks etc, not good. Both parks enjoyable. The kids went on all the rides. Me only some of them. Seaworld—Good but probably for smaller children than for Mid Teens. Over all 9 out of 10 the lot. The best holiday the kids have had. Its peak time at the Parks etc. Gold Coast had lots of cars worse than Melbourne.

Time to leave Locky and Daniel are tired and don't want to drive. I drive the Magna and Imee the Falcon auto.

It is nearly 7.30am before we leave. We drove down the Pacific Hwy to Grafton Then the same route in reverse to home.

We had a Chinese meal at Tamworth, then on to Gunnedah for the night. We stopped at a Caravan Park which I have forgotten the name. It was Ok. All tired by this time. Locky and Daniel were driving again and we were homeward bound. I drove the Falcon for a few hours. The Theme Parks and Late nights had caught up with the two young drivers.

I was taking turns with each car to have a drive . I think Lockys old Magna was The oldest car on the Highway. But it went great ,so did Daniels Falcon. The Falcon would cruise at 2000rpm , where the Magna 3000rpm. No problems . Coming down from Dubbo –Forbes etc it was very hot, just glad the air con was ok in both cars. Nearly home at Narrandera it was 42 degrees. All home safe and sound.

At Jerilderie we stop and have a cup of tea and a sandwich with a friend . Then an easy drive home to Mooroopna. Both cars ran well . Pleased with the Magna on gas. Imee a falcon fan. The Magna a smaller engine and inside cabin area was the pick. I'm a believer in LPG. I'll have a word to Daniel. On the home front ,well the Macintosh residence is blessed with two boys, OOPS that should be two toys.

Firstly a 1949 MGTC , while not absolutely original its close as can be . You would have to be an expert to notice the difference. The other arrival is a Harley Davidson trike . Lovely 10years old . All Harley and its wine colour. Drives Nice. On the down side of life the MG Spridget has gone for a heart transplant with a new brain needed as well and a new blood monitor. I think he is having a word to "Uncle Lance". If he can keep off the TV. He needs to be put in jail . But Cycling is bigger than Lance and can only get better. Locky is waiting to go in the forces. I guess a couple of months to wait. Been driving around in the A30. It's going Ok.

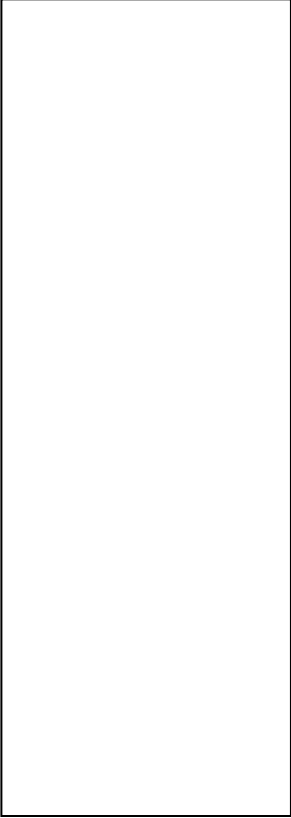
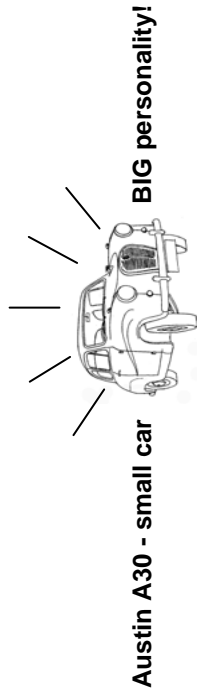
